AGGA Accredited Companies must follow a number of compliance requirements. These requirements ensure that companies are meeting all regulations and that clients will have peace of mind.

Insurance

Business insurance with an appropriate level and scope of cover is important to protect the business as well as customers and the general public. Glass Labelling

Labelling of glass is an important compliance aspect of AS/NZS 1288, and one which is not well policed by building surveyors or building owners/managers. AGGA has developed a range of glass labels that are available for members to purchase and can be used on most types of glass. These labels include the company name and are only available to Accredited Companies, so they also serve an important role in promoting the company's Accredited status.

When Accredited Companies are audited by the AGGA, the compliant use of glass labels will also be part of this audit. Non-compliance to glass labelling could potentially lead to loss of Accredited Company status.

AGGA sells appropriate labels to Accredited Companies that include their company details and accreditation number. To order glass labels contact the AGGA office or go to agga.org.au/accreditation/compliance

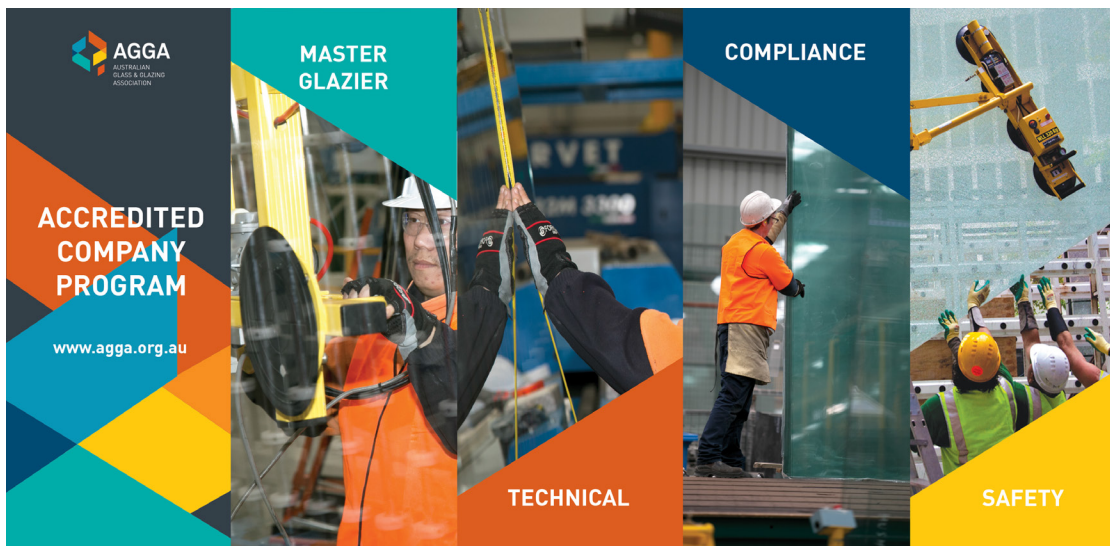
Glazing Certificates

The AGGA Glazing Certificate is a central part of the Accredited Company program. The certificates will:

- Be issued by Accredited Companies at the completion of jobs.
- Provide assurance that work complies with Australian Standards.
- Provide customers with a third party (AGGA) to mediate on complaints.
- Will be promoted to building certifiers, local government and consumers as the 'must-have' for all glazing work.

- Take less than a minute to issue via web, tablet or smartphone.
- Provide the option to store additional job data in your own job database.

The online AGGA Glazing Certificate system is only available to Accredited Companies and provides a reputable certification that is backed by the association. While Accredited Companies will only be required to use the AGGA Glazing Certificate when requested by a client, we encourage companies to use the AGGA Glazing Certificate system to reinforce your Accredited Company status.
